Thank you so much for giving me the opportunity to work on this project for you! I had a lot of fun with the design and hope you like what you see! I know there's a lot of information in this email, but I want to make sure you have everything you need to carry out the designs for your space. First, I want to explain the attached design board so you understand what you're looking at:

- **PAINT**: The Paint Scheme I used in your design is as follows:

Option 1: Ceilings + Trim | WHITE: Sherwin Williams - Snowbound SW7004 Option 1: Walls | GREIGE: Sherwin Williams - Agreeable Gray SW7029

Option 2: Ceilings + Trim | WHITE: Dunn Edwards - Cool December DEW383

Option 2: Walls | WARM GRAY: Dunn Edwards - Cloud DEC791

Option 3: Ceilings + Trim | WHITE: Benjamin Moore - Chantilly Lace OC-65

Option 3: Walls | COOL GRAY: Benjamin Moore - Sterling 1591

For walls I prefer an eggshell finish and for ceilings I like a matte finish, but an eggshell finish for both is also very common. For baseboards, door and window trim, use a semi-gloss finish.

Tips + Tricks:

- Make sure to take off all switch plates, outlet plates, artwork, sconces, or whatever else might be up on your walls for a clean slate!
- Cutting In: For all the edges (i.e. where the ceiling meets the wall or around trim) be sure to use an angled brush! If you don't have a steady hand or don't trust yourself, blue painters tape is your new best friend!
- Be sure to lay down plastic or a rag at least in the space you are working in. I prefer to cover any
 furniture/flooring with plastic especially when I'm doing the ceilings, because when you use a roller, there
 will 100% be 'paint spray'
